

Connect2 Community Network Background Information

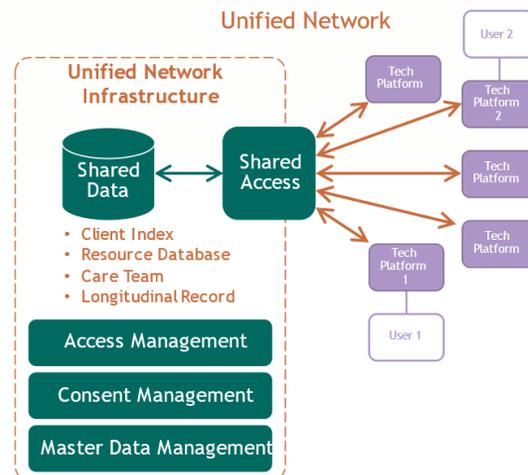
The shared vision co-developed with over 100 partners representing health care, government, and Community Based Organizations follows: Strengthen the coordination of care for those in need by connecting people, service organizations, and community partners more quickly and more effectively – resulting in a healthier, more equitable community for all.

Our approach to county-wide CIE in King County is to create and maintain a “Unified Network” to support and connect multiple existing or emerging technology platforms, some of which might identify themselves as CIE platforms, that connect, communicate, and cooperate as a unified whole. The Unified Network provides the infrastructure necessary to facilitate efficient and reliable communication among the technology platforms used by clinical- and community-based partners but is not necessarily a CIE platform itself. A high-level summary of the RFP architecture, components, and services is shown here:

Technology Request for Proposals (RFP)



- Unified Network Infrastructure components
 - Shared access hub
 - Shared data
 - Access management
 - Consent management
 - Master data management
- Implementation services to build
- Operations services to keep system running



The goal is to have two technology platforms exchanging data using the Unified Network infrastructure by Q2 2022. Additional technology platforms and functions will be added over a 3-year period and beyond. The 3-year budget for Connect2 Community Network (not just technology) is approximately \$18 million.

The purpose of the RFP is to procure the software components necessary for the Unified Network, the technical services of a vendor to implement the technical solution and integrate with technical platforms of selected partners, and the technical services of a vendor to operate the technical solution, including hosting.

Eligibility Criteria and Response Model:

- Established organization or company that provides one or more of the following products and services relevant to the Unified Network Infrastructure:
 - System integration services
 - Commercial, off-the-shelf software to support data sharing across organizations for the following functions:
 - Shared access hub / gateway
 - Shared data
 - Access management
 - Consent management
 - Master data management
 - Software as a Service
 - Managed IT services for IT operations and support
- The preferred response model is one Prime contractor to build and operate the Unified Network Infrastructure as described in the Plan. Responses that include a Prime and full team providing all requested services will receive significant bonus points during evaluation.
- In the preferred model, the Prime contractor will assemble a team which may include:
 - System integrators
 - Independent software vendors
 - Software as a Service (SaaS, Paas, Iaas) vendors
 - Managed IT service vendors
- A solution using commercially available, off-the-shelf and configurable products is preferred.
- All solutions are welcome. Connect2 Community Network does not have an incumbent prime contractor or vendor.
